

The Home Pool

This summer is flying by, and we're well past the 4th of July; the major hatches are past and the waters are low and warming. You should be fishing early in the morning starting before sunrise or late in the evening. This is also a time of year to try fly fishing for warm water species such as bass and panfish. Try fishing from a kayak or float tube. Remember to check fishing regulations since some Fish Commission lakes have a minimum size limit even for panfish. If you're successful, there is an excellent You Tube video called The Best Fish Filleting Method. It is a very efficient method to get fillets from small fish like bluegills and crappie.

Make sure you have insect repellent applied to you and your clothing as I have seen people finding ticks on them while they were only on the cut lawn in their yards. Remember, when fishing, you will be approaching streams walking through tall grass, brush, under tree cover, the environment where ticks live and breed. Recently there have been reports of new mosquito-borne diseases and the repellent that will protect you from them. Remember to keep the repellent off your hands and fingers since it should not come into contact with your eyes or mouth. You also do not want to get DEET (found in repellents) on fly lines, monofilament, or plastic as it can dissolve the finishes on the lines making them weaker and no longer waterproof; consequently, they won't float.

With the warm temperatures, you need to remain adequately hydrated. I find a water bladder like a Camelback in the back pocket of my vest encourages me to drink since I only need to take in the mouthpiece and squeeze it to drink, leaving my hands free to fish.

Sunscreen is also necessary not only to prevent sunburn but to assist in preventing skin cancer. It should be applied even on overcast days to protect you from UV rays. You also need to wear Polaroid sunglasses, not just for seeing fish, but to protect your eyes from damage that can lead to cataracts from sun exposure. They also protect you from flies blown back on casts, springing back when tugged from brush and twigs that invariably seem to be at eye level as you walk through the woods. I have worn glasses since I've been a child, and I am amazed how twigs manage to get behind the lenses from the side: so, I wear wraparound sunglasses (or safety glasses when hunting.)

Lastly, have a Ziploc bag for your phone and a small sliver of soap or a hand sanitizer to wash off if you accidentally touch poison ivy. If you hear thunder, you are too close to an approaching storm; immediately get out of the water, get under cover, break down your rod and get into your vehicle quickly. Your rod is a big lightning rod, especially when wet. If you get caught in a T-storm put the rod on the ground and squat way from large trees. Howeer, the best action is to seek shelter, even if it is only to get into your vehicle...and DO NOT touch metal surfaces; the tries insulate you from the ground.

This August, Healing Waters will fish the McMichael Creek at the Indian Mountain Rod & Gun Club August 13. contact me if you need directions. On Sunday, August 10th we will also participate at the Brodhead Watershed Associations annual BWA River Ramble at the new For Evergreen site on the Brodhead Creek just off Cherry Lane. This will be the last column I will be writing for the newsletter and/or website since I will be ending my tenure as Chapter President wen elections are held at our next General Meeting. I want to remind you the best times to fish often coincide with the spring and fall hunting, so wear some blaze orange for safety as you walk through the woods and fields.

I wish you tight lines and many enjoyable days in the woods and on the water. Look around; you do not have to catch fish or kill game to enjoy your days afield. The memories you make will sustain you when you can't get outdoors.


