nce again, I am sitting here on a warm day in February, writing this column as the temperatures remain in the forty to fifty degree range. Twice last week I found little black stoneflies crawling on the wall outside my house. I have also received emails from Todd Burns indicating that he noticed hatches of them while fishing the Pocono Creek. The fishing season seems to be knocking on the door with this warm weather. We all should be readying gear, tying flies and getting out whenever possible to fish.

The PA Fish & Boat Commission web page is a great place to start. Eric Weredyk, Northeast Region Waterways Conservation Officer, stopped by our February meeting to explain how the commission's webpage has been made more interactive and useful to anglers. You can look at county maps and check where streams are to fish, check on local reports on fishing or order your license on-line and print it. I asked Eric to explain "Approved Trout Waters" to our members. Basically any stream on the list of Approved Trout Waters is being managed and or stocked by the Fish Commission; these waters are closed to fishing March 1, 2012, while stocking is taking place. Streams that are not listed are not being managed, and you are able to fish them as long as you practice catch and release. You must have a trout stamp to fish any stream. You may also fish any delayed harvest, or catch and release (fly fishing only) stream.

All of our board members are selling tickets for our March 31 banquet, and we are actively soliciting donations for prizes for the banquet. You can contact any board member or call Eric Baird (570) 355-0165 to get tickets.

L his month's fly supports the adage that less is more. The Zebra Midge is a nice, all-purpose nymph pattern. The black body with the highly contrasting gold bead and silver wire serves up a dish that trout find hard to resist. It's also a tiny fly, usually tied in size 18 or smaller, which also works in its favor. Think of these like a bowl full of popcorn that trout will snack on all day long!

## Zebra Midge

## TYING STEPS

- 1. Load a bead onto the hook, then start your thread behind the bead. Make a thread base along the shank and part way around the bend of the hook.
- Return the thread to the bead, then tie on a piece of silver wire. To do this, hold the wire beneath the shank at a 45 degree angle and trap it against the shank with 3 or 4 loose wraps of thread.

Next, gently pull the wire straight back along the shank until the tip of the wire slides beneath the thread wraps. Now continue binding the wire to the bottom of the shank by holding the wire under moderate tension below the level of the hook and wrapping the thread in touching turns. Bind the wire to the point where your thread base ends, around the bend of the hook.

- 3. Return your thread to the bead (in touching turns.) Create a tapered body by layering thread partway down the shank and back to the bead a few times until the taper is created. End this process with your thread hanging at the bead.
- 4. Rib the body with the silver wire. Tie off and trim the wire behind the bead. Whip finish behind the bead and cement.

Tie up a bowl full of these and watch the trout come running! contest fly. The contest will resume with next month's fly.

Ribbing:	silver wire
