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

pring fishing season (and Spring Turkey) is rapidly approaching, and many of us have been indoors more than we would have liked to be this winter. As I pen this column, I am a little over 30 days into my 90 day sentence since my coronary bypass surgery. I was told I could not even cast a fly rod until my 90 days are up. I feel like I've been doing a stretch in the pokey, but after what they tell me was "a bump in the road" to recovery putting me back in Pocono February 5; I may not want to, but I'm being very patient and behaving myself.

My suggestion to you is get in shape to fish! Walk as much as you can; start on pavement (wear bright colors or a runner's vest near roads) if just beginning, but get on woodland trails to develop your legs. The off pavement walking requires muscles in the legs and feet to balance on the often uneven surface. Take your staff with you so you are used to carrying it; then, add weight like your vest or a small pack with some weight, since this will simulate the extra weight that fishing gear and waders add as resistance to your walking. Check your pulse at your wrist; checking at the carotid can slow your heart due to a nerve located right alongside, stimulating the heart to slow. Keep your heart rate below 120 (or 75% of 220-your age). A good rule of thumb for pace is to walk with a buddy and be able to talk as you walk.

Stretch before and after your walk and when you fish. You can also carry a ball around to squeeze developing your forearm muscles which control your grip. Get your rod or practice rod out and practice your casting for timing

and accuracy. Distance will increase with practice! Remember, the more line on the water, the harder it can be to control: but, it is fun to lay the line out in practice. Make sure you practice each way you need to cast to fish; for example, on your off side or practice with the non-dominant hand.

Eat correctly; include a lot of water, fruits, and vegetables. Plan how you can include water to drink while fishing; as it gets warmer, you can prevent cramps by staying hydrated.

You should try not to fish alone; go with a buddy, or have a non-fishing buddy come along who is within sight of you. A very good friend lost his grandson who went out fishing in his boat alone, fell striking his head and ended up hanging over the side of the boat drowning. Someone who enjoys a hike, likes to take pictures, or draws can go with you, insuring your safety. Plan your fishing trip and stick to the plan. Leave your route and estimated time of return in writing with a responsible person at home that you check in with upon your return.

Carry your cell phone in a quart size zip lock freezer bag so it will survive an accidental dunking. You should also carry your wallet or ID in a zip lock, as well. I now have to carry cards which show what was done to me, as well as a list of all my medicines, to present to emergency responders.

Carry a small first aid kit, a waterproof match case, and a whistle to alert searchers. Know how to build a small fire in case you get stuck out at night; it will cheer you and help searchers locate you. A compass will help you redirect yourself if you get turned around. Know the skills needed to use these items before you need them!

Now the good stuff! We are running a CATSKILL trip again. (See page 9.) Will has reserved a block of ten rooms for the Friday and Saturday (5/24 & 5/25) of Memorial Day weekend. Last year we had a great trip, and this year, the hatches will be better as we are later in the season. You will also note we are looking into forming a small group for a fall trip in Central PA this year, as well as a Colorado Trip in 2014. (See page 10.)

Our chapter hosted a Coldwater Conservation Corps training session on 2/23/13. We are monitoring streams within the Brodhead watershed (Ellen Davis and BWA), Tobyhanna-Tunkahannock watershed (Trish Attardo), and the Pohopoco-Middle Creek watershed (Rich Newell). Bonnie Smith has been monitoring the Choke Creek and upper Lehigh since the summer. This stream monitoring will produce baseline data to document pollution events related to fracking or pipeline work. While the DRBC has not given permission for gas drilling to begin, pipeline work is already having an impact in our area and neighboring counties. The information gained by our efforts will be shared electronically through the CCC's website, set up by Mitch Blake the coordinator. Will Daskal will soon have the testing manual in PDF format on our website, and we will conduct our own training to get more personnel involved in testing. Any member who would like to assist in the program, please let me know. The more members we have helping, the greater our ability to engage the participants taking the program in friendly one-on-one encouragement. We very often gain new chapter members from this seminar. With more people assisting and offering camaraderie, we can gain more members as they see the fun we have together.

I hope to see many of you at our Spring Banquet March 15; we have some great prizes and some additional fun-filled activities to entertain you this year. (See pages 4 to 7.)

I also hope to have a great turnout for the Riparian zone tree planting April 28 in SGL 127 along SR 423 in Tobyhanna; the more hands the easier the work! (See page 14.)

AND NOW FOR SOMETHING COMPLETELY DIFFERENT! The April 10, 2013 Chapter General Meeting will be held on the McMichael Creek near the conservation project site. We will have refreshments at the golf course clubhouse and fish the improved area of the creek. The area is a Delayed Harvest Area, so it is open to fishing year round.

Remember April 13 is our northern zone Trout opener and we will co-host the Kid's Fishing Contest along with the Knights of Columbus, Stroud Township, and the PA Fish Commission. (See page 17.)



Since the average age of our chapter members is on the north side of middle age, I thought I'd share this valuable material that was sent to me by an artist friend who's also a critical care nurse! It's from the Mayo Clinic, with some added material she provided. I think it may prove very beneficial for many of our TU members!

How many folks do you know who say they don't want to drink anything before going to bed because they'll have to get up during the night? Heart Attack and Water - I never knew all of this! Interesting...Something else I didn't know...I asked my Doctor why people need to urinate so much at night time. Answer from my Cardiac Doctor - Gravity holds water in the lower part of your body when you are upright (legs swell). When you lie down and the lower body (legs and etc.) seeks level with the kidneys, it is then that the kidneys remove the water because it is easier. This then ties in with the last statement! I knew you need your minimum water to help flush the toxins out of your body, but this was news to me. Correct time to drink water... Very Important. From A Cardiac Specialist! Drinking water at a certain time maximizes its effectiveness on the body:

- 2 glasses of water after waking up helps activate internal organs
- 1 glass of water 30 minutes before a meal helps digestion
- 1 glass of water before taking a bath helps lower blood pressure
- 1 glass of water before going to bed avoids stroke or heart attack

I can also add to this... My Physician told me that water at bed time will also help prevent night time leg cramps. Your leg muscles are seeking hydration when they cramp and wake you up with a Charlie Horse.


<u>Subject: Mayo Clinic on Aspirin - PASS IT ON:</u> Most heart attacks occur in the day, generally between 6 A.M. and noon. Having one during the night, when the heart should be most at rest, means that something unusual happened. Somers and his colleagues have been working for a decade to show that sleep apnea is to blame.

1. If you take an aspirin or a baby aspirin once a day, take it at night. The reason: Aspirin has a 24-hour "half-life"; therefore, if most heart attacks happen in the wee hours of the morning, the Aspirin would be strongest in your system.

2. FYI, Aspirin lasts a really long time in your medicine chest for years, (when it gets old, it smells like vinegar). Something that we can do to help ourselves - nice to know. Bayer is making crystal aspirin to dissolve instantly on the tongue. They work much faster than the tablets.

Why keep Aspirin by your bedside? It's about Heart Attacks — There are other symptoms of a heart attack, besides the pain on the left arm. One must also be aware of an intense pain on the chin, as well as nausea and lots of sweating; however, these symptoms may also occur less frequently. <u>Note: There may be NO pain in the chest during a heart attack.</u> The majority of people (about 60%) who had a heart attack during their sleep did not wake up. However, if it occurs, the chest pain may wake you up from your deep sleep. If that happens, immediately dissolve two aspirins in your mouth and swallow them with a bit of water. Afterwards: - Call 911. - Phone a neighbor or a family member who lives very close by. Say "heart attack!" - Say that you have taken 2 Aspirins. - Take a seat on a chair or sofa near the front door, and wait for their arrival and ...<u>DO NOT LIE DOWN</u>! A Cardiologist has stated that if each person after receiving this information, sends it to 10 people, probably one life could be saved! I have already shared this information. What about you? Do forward this message. It may save lives! "Life is a one time gift"


