

I have been spending a lot of time training my new Golden puppy, Reilly, and looking for ponds to have him practice water retrieves. I am also learning to budget my time differently since it seems that there's always something interesting that I want to be involved in, or that needs my attention.

I have spent a lot of time helping the committee that has developed into the Monroe County Youth Field Day organization. I have been demonstrating retrieving with my dogs for fifteen years at the annual youth field day. This year, Randy Schuler, who ran this free event for kids, has made a big change by fulfilling a lifelong dream, moving to Alaska. I started the drive to organize local gun clubs to continue what Randy had done by himself with the help of his wife and about three others. 

In late July, on the way home from dog training in the Delaware Water Gap National Park, I had to remove a tick from my throat . We trained in some brushy ponds there. It was a very difficult task to remove it by using a side view mirror and locking forceps. Fortunately, the woman at Vector Control told me it wasn't a tick species that carried Lyme disease. That week, I bought a Tick Key to make tick removal faster and easier. All my clothes for outdoors now get sprayed before I go out. This
