

Welcome to Fall!

The leaves have changed and dropped, the time has fallen back, and the uncertainty within the Pocono region has thankfully been put to rest. It's time to try to get back to "normal," if there is such a thing.

Our elections, local and state, are completed and I am sure you got to the polls and cast your ballot for your candidates of choice. Please remember to continue to make contacts with your Representatives and Senators as we move through the holidays and look ahead to future legislative sessions. Whether you agree or disagree with a bill, act, or a stance on an issue, this communication is essential for a representative democracy to function as efficiently as possible. And, while I'm speaking of legislative functions, you should be aware House Bill #1565 did pass in a Senate vote a few weeks ago. We now await as regulatory issues surrounding the new law are formulated. We'll continue to keep you up to date and I sincerely thank all of those who expressed their opinions up to this point.

One of our proposed projects for the upcoming year is stream improvement work on the McMichaels Creek on county property near Manor Drive and Route 33. While fishing up through that section I was again struck by the absolute lack of large rocks! If you walk (or fish) from the softball field upstream to behind the football fields, you'll be hard-pressed to find rocks larger than a basketball on the stream bot-

tom. Certainly the local geology with respect to glacial deposits has something to do with it. When one considers the flow volume that comes through there in the spring and other high water events, boulders and diverters could have great effects in creating current seams and holding areas, establishing some deeper water, stabilizing the stream banks and providing some much needed cover. Stream improvement work here could have a great impact.

Keep in mind that not only TU chapters do work on the streams. In fact, nature's engineer, the beaver, can do his own stream improvement work. If you're out and come across scenes like those below, you know you're in the presence of beavers.




Also, as you can see in the photo on the right, we are in desperate need of precipitation. Stream flows are the lowest I've seen them in many years and if the groundwater isn't replenished prior to the winter freeze, we'll be in for some extreme low-water conditions post run-off in the spring. We can't do anything to help other than hope we get some rainy weather.

As I get ready to sign off, I want to remind you to be careful where you wade this time of year. Spawning redds with eggs will be found in the tail-outs of pools or slicks. These usually appear as round "clean" areas where the trout have sculpted a nest on the stream bottom. Also, we'll be sending out a revised chapter calendar of activities so you can plan ahead for 2015. Take care, keep warm, and get outside and enjoy the weather.




