

Dear Members and Friends:

Happy April and welcome to Spring! Air temperatures have finally crept up into the 40's (no April Fool's joke, I promise) and water temperatures will soon follow. Once the macro-invertebrates begin to stir the trout will follow suit. I'm sure we, just like our friends in the water, will begin to move about and enjoy the warmth that spring brings us.

I want to thank all our members and friends who demonstrated true pioneer spirit in navigating through the snowstorm on March 20 and attended our spring banquet. We experienced a 90% attendance rate, had a wonderful time renewing acquaintances, enjoyed a fine meal and raised needed funds for our project work in the Pocono Creek this year. I also want to thank all those who donated items for all the prize raffles. Without your generosity this would not have been possible.

On Saturday, March 28, we conducted the annual Fly Fishing Workshop for the Monroe County Conservation District. We had approximately 100 participants which is about five times the normal enrollment. That was phenomenal and a quick survey indicated good old paper advertising was key.

As I look at the calendar, I see our next General Membership meeting is rapidly approaching. We will convene on Wednesday, April 8, 2015 at the Kettle Creek Environmental Education Center at 7 PM. Our speaker will be Joe Baylog and his topic will be "Do It Yourself Alaska." This should be a

great program to get us excited as we begin to open trout season here at home.

There are two items on the PA Fish and Boat Commission web page on which we can, and should make comment. The proposed changes for the DHALO areas lasts until May 13, 2015. We've put out considerable information on this over the past month and I ask you to let you thoughts on the proposal be heard. Personally, I believe the proposal is ill-advised in that it will encourage the harvesting of wild trout, will provide regulatory nightmares for enforcement personnel, and the proposed timeframes will contradict or oppose the intended purpose of encouraging young fishermen. Please don't forget to write!

We missed a posting on the classification of Wild Trout Streams and it's comment period ended March 30. I did send an email missive out to our members for whom we have active email addresses so I hope you saw that. In a nutshell, the Fish and Boat Commission is actively surveying various streams throughout the state, looking for wild trout populations. This is a great program, one that is seeking to recognize the cold-water resources throughout the state and we do support it. I was able to fire off my comments late last week.

I am in the process of composing a letter to be sent to the landowners along the Phase I of our Pocono Creek restoration project. This project will go forward this summer and will focus on that stretch of the creek upstream of the bridge to the old Northampton Community College campus. I know the Projects Committee and the Board of Directors is highly excited about the positive effects this habitat restoration will have on the life in the creek. Given its location within Tannersville, we believe many people will have the opportunity to enjoy the results.

Due to a convergence of different circumstances, we have cancelled the May trip to the Catskills. But, if you're in the mood to go, don't let that stop you! It certainly can be done in a long day trip so find a fishing budding and head north to some beautiful water.

I've included a small article with photos regarding our Trout in the Classroom project at Swiftwater Intermediate School. The fish are doing well, the kids are learning, and in a few weeks those fry will be swimming in the wild.

Opening day of trout season is April 18, at 8:00 AM and that means we're off to Brodhead Park to assist the Knights of Columbus and Stroud Township with the annual kid's fishing contest. This is usually a well-attended event and seeing the faces of the kids as they reel in, what for many, is their first trout is well worth the time. Last year, we even had the bonus of seeing a pair of bald eagles, one of whom perched on a large tree across the Brodhead. Come on out and help us help kids enjoy the sport of fishing.

A brief look ahead into May and June shows our general membership meeting on May 13 and the annual chapter picnic along the Brodhead on June 13th. I hope to see you soon.

Trout in the Classroom Update

The Brodhead Chapter supports a Trout in the Classroom program at Swiftwater Intermediate School in Swiftwater, PA. Approximately 60 brook trout have hatched and reached 2+ inches in length. The sixth grade students learn about the need for cold, clean waters to support wild trout and their growth. They learn about optimal temperatures, flowing water, pollution and other factors that impact upon the growth of brook trout. Fry should be released some time in May and we'll keep you posted. 
PA Fish & Boat Proposes Changes to Delayed Harvest Artificial Lures Only Sections.

Whereas the Brodhead Chapter has invested considerable time, funds, and effort in improving the habitat within the DHALO section of McMichaels Creek near Glen Brook, we want you to know about proposed rule changes that could affect this section. At its January 22, 2015 Commissioner's Meeting, the PAFBC advanced a proposal that would significantly alter the rules for fishing in such waters. Be aware the public comment period should open soon.

The proposed rule changes would:

- 1. Move the harvest start date to the Saturday before Memorial Day from June 15,
- 2. Change the minimum size of harvested trout to 7 inches from 9 inches,
- 3. Allow the use of bait by any angler during the harvesting period,
- 4. Allow youth anglers under 16 years of age to use bait during harvest AND non-harvest periods
