

Dear Members and Friends:

We have been doing our best to keep you up to date on proposals generated and posted by the PA Fish and Boat commission as well as our Pennsylania and Federal governments. We hope you have found, and will continue to find, these notices informative and useful.

Currently, there are some additional proposed language changes to the PAFBC rules and regulations that will affect streams in our area and thus may interest you. I post this information within the next section for your review and I encourage you to frequently check the Fish and Boat Commission's web site. They have made it much easier to find information via their various links.

Also, we have posted or emailed members about the various state or federal legislative proposals that would affect the cold-water environments that have made the Poconos a recreational destination for generations. It is important for all of us to be aware of what is being discussed and to respond as needed. Although we can send information blasts out via Twitter or Instagram, an email direct to your Inbox works great and you won't miss it! If you need to update your email address with us, please let us know—we will be happy to make the change.

I want to thank those members who represented TU in the ForEvergreen Earth Day events on April 26th. Your efforts and your volunteerism are the foundation of our and other local conservation or

ganizations. We thank the Brodhead Watershed Association, the Pocono Heritage Land Trust, and Stroud Township for including us in this event. And I also want to thank those Brodhead TU members who conducted the Fly Fishing Clinic at the Pocono Environmental Education Center on that same date. We were spread thin but we made it happen.

The plans for the Pocono Creek restoration this summer are just about finalized and we will be meeting with our contractor and partners near the end of May to plot out exact locations of devices, entry and exit points into and from the stream, temporary rock storage areas and similar logistics. Part of our plans include involving a Northampton County Community College intern in various stream studies to document the exiting conditions prior to our work and those that will be developed as a result of that work. Expect to see macro-invertebrate sampling, some electroshocking work and the creation of 2-D and 3-D stream profiles. We have the opportunity to "do it right" and we are taking advantage of that opportunity.

Continuing our work with the Monroe County Conservation District, and in support of our Mission, the Board voted to fund four youth campers to the MCCD Summer Camp this summer. This is a wonderful opportunity for young people to learn about the outdoors and what our Pocono region has to offer. We are sure the kids will have a great time with their learning and will leave with renewed interest in the nature that envelopes and sustains us all.

Board member Russell Thrall has developed a brief survey for our members and it will take less than five (5) minutes to complete! The survey and directions will be released in the near future and we look forward to your answers, comments, and suggestions. It is through this type of feedback that we can continue to grow as a cold-water conservation organization. I sincerely ask that you complete this—your ideas are important to us.

As summer nears we will be posting more and more information regarding the National TU Annual Meeting that will be held in Scranton, PA this fall. The dates are September 16-20, 2015, and the event will be headquartered in the Scranton Hilton. One of our responsibilities will be to staff a hospitality suite on Thursday night (8 PM) and we will be looking for 8 volunteers to help out and keep up with what National TU believes will be a very large crowd. Whereas we are so close to New York, Philadelphia, Boston, and the Washington, D.C. areas, odds are good an attendance record could be set!

As May unfolds, I sincerely hope you will be able to get out on your favorite stream to enjoy scenery, the wildlife, and the fishing. The sulphurs are only a few weeks away so stock up on those emergers, duns, and rusty spinners!

Brodhead TU will assist the National Park Service in their Kids Fishing Clinic to be held Sunday, May 24, 2015 at Hidden Lake, Middle Smithfield Township, Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area. The entire program, from set-up through tear down, should run from 8 AM to 1 PM. TU members will run and assist with the following instructional stations: knot-tying, bait and tackle, ethical angler, and fish identification. Trout in the Classroom Update: May 2015


The Brodhead Chapter continues to support a Trout in the Classroom program at Swiftwater Intermediate School in Swiftwater, PA. Approximately 60 brook trout have hatched and reached 3 inches in length. The students learned about the need for cold, clean waters to support wild trout and their growth. They learned about optimal temperatures, flowing water, pollution and other factors that impact upon the growth of brook trout. Fingerlings will be released into the McMichaels Creek some time in early June As you can see, the fish are starting to get their colors!

Changes in Regulation Language and Regulations.





The Fish Commission is proposing some language changes and one, Chapter 63.3, that we think will be beneficial is the replacement of the term "approved trout waters" with "stocked trout waters." As there was often confusion if a water was approved or not, it is relatively easy to see what waters are stocked. Also, a proposed change in regulations would address Chapter 65.13. The Commission proposes eliminating the Brook Trout Enhancement program in its entirety. Basically, the research has shown the program was ineffective in its goal to enhance wild trout in select streams. In our area, two brookie streams were included on the list: Wolf Swamp Run coming off Camelback Mountain and Wolf Swamp Lake and Kistler Run off Route 423.
