


### September 2015

If the weather and logistics fall into place, we anticipate engaging in our Pocono Creek stream restoration project sometime in the last weeks in September. You'll find more information on a baseline electro-shocking study Brodhead TU sponsored and assisted with on page 4 of this newsletter. It was a great day!

I will be presenting my ideas, tactics and experiences for winter fishing small trout streams during our October General Membership meeting. Just because it's cold outside don't think the fish aren't hungry...they are...and knowing what to do can make the winter days on the stream very enjoyable.

We are trying something different and are joining with Wester Pocono TU in sponsoring a joint, community-based meeting at the Clymer Library in Pocono Pines on Wednesday, November 19 at 6 PM. The focus of the meeting will be on Pennsylvania's gas pipelines and their impacts on our Pocono watersheds. Yes, the location is different, the time is different, and the format is different but this event will provide all of us with a wealth of information on a topic that has immediate and far-reaching implications.

It is that time of year where we look at updating our strategic action plan and we need your input. Please visit our webpage (http://brodheadtu.org/strategic-plan/) and read through our Strategic Plan and provide us with some feedback. Once we receive your ideas, we can modify our document. Remember, this is the document that guides our activities now and into the future and every idea you have counts.

There are two issues on the legislative front I need to point out. Recently, an op-ed piece ran in the Pocono Record, authored by Bud Cook of The Nature Conservancy, that discusses the impending end of the Land and Water Conservation Fund. Congress needs to reauthorize this legislation so funding for green space, parks, and waters will not cease at the end of September. Also, be advised that 13 states have filed suit challenging the "Waters of the U.S." rule that was implemented by the Environmental Protection Agency and another 17 states are also challenging it. Pennsylvania, to date, has not yet officially challenged but it is necessary to follow this process as it plays out.

I congratulate Brodhead TU Board Member Ann Foster on her selection as a staff member for the Casting For Recovery retreat being held at Skytop Lodge this September. We look forward to an update and recap from Ann after the event closes. And, finally, we have signed on to sponsor local Project Healing waters activities. Stay tuned for more information!

### Electro-shocking Study Conducted on Pocono Creek

On Thursday, August 13, 2015, 17 individuals from Brodhead TU, Western Pocono TU, MCCD, Brodhead Watershed Association, Pocono Heritage Land Trust and other like-minded organizations assisted with an electro-shocking survey on Pocono Creek. The stretch studied was within the boundaries of the upcoming stream improvement project near the former Northampton Community College in Tannersville, PA. The data collected will serve as a baseline or pre-project data to which future data may be compared. # **Pennsylvania's Gas Pipelines** Avoiding & Minimizing Impacts on Streams

he Brodhead and Western Pocono Chapters of TROUT UNLIMITED (TU) are proud to announce a unique, jointly-sponsored, program about how TU is working to make sure that impacts from major interstate pipelines on the commonwealth's coldwater streams are avoided or minimized. This innovative program will be offered <u>FREE</u> to the public on Thursday, November 19, 2015 at the Clymer Library, 115 Firehouse Road, Pocono Pines, PA from 6:00-8:00pm. The evening features three members of Trout Unlimited's national staff.

According to the Department of Environmental Protection, Pennsylvania is expected to see up to 27,000 miles of new pipelines by 2030. Katy Dunlap, TU's eastern water project director, will describe Pennsylvania's landscape of proposed major pipelines, potential impacts to water resources and fisheries, and the regulatory framework for major natural gas pipelines. Jake Lemon, TU's eastern shale gas monitoring coordinator, will explain how citizens can play a practical role in watching over coldwater streams by conducting pipeline monitoring before, during and after construction. Paula Piatt, TU's eastern sportsmen organizer, will describe how TU is

working to achieve protective water quality and fisheries designations to ensure that as pipelines are permitted, appropriate conditions are placed on development.

This is a major, cooperative joint venture developed by TU for the benefit of sportsmen and women in the Poconos, as well as surrounding areas. This program represents TROUT UNLIMITED at its best working together to create protection and awareness of conservation of Pocono trout and their vital fresh water habitat.




