

Dear Members and Friends:

"All great and honorable actions are accompanied with great difficulties, and both must be enterprised and overcome with answerable courage." When William Bradford, of Plymouth Plantation, wrote that in 1620, what is now the Poconos was a vast forest, devoid of macadam, concrete, houses, cars, and for the most part, humans. For almost 400 years our region has evolved from a wilderness to a popular vacation mecca and along with that transformation has come the inevitable human impact on our natural resources.

Decades ago, the natural stream bed of Pocono Creek through the Tannersville area was channelized. Intended as a means of flood control, the stream channel was straightened and the rocks scoured from the bottom and set to line the banks. With no cover and no large rocks to provide current seams and depth, the creek ran shallow and relatively wide. This is not the type of habitat in which native brook trout or wild brown trout thrive. As such, our Brodhead Chapter sought to begin the process of restoring the habitat on a stretch of this stream.

Working in cooperation with the Pocono Heritage Land Trust, owners of a tract along the Pocono Creek upstream of the Old Mill Road bridge, Brodhead TU drew up plans that call for the placement of large boulders, rock veins, and other structures that will provide current seams, a narrowing and deepening of the stream channel and improvement of habitat for wild and native trout. Through the efforts of Brodhead TU members, the support of the Pocono Heritage Land Trust, concerned members of our community, and the generosity of Northampton Community College and our contractor Bill Hakim, and the assistance of Pocono Township, I am pleased to report that Phase I of this project is completed. In two 3-day phases, several hundred boulders to be used in construction of devices were moved onto the PHLT tract and will be placed into the stream in early summer 2016. By 2017, we should be able to again collect data on the fish population and compare it to our electrofishing results from this summer. We have no doubt the difference will be significant and positive, providing added recreational opportunities within the busy Route 611 corridor for all members of the community.

While we are waiting to finish this project, Brodhead TU is forming a work group to begin planning another habitat improvement project on the creek. We will formulate our ideas into a workable plan during the winter months and begin the process. As these initial thoughts morph into more concrete plans, we'll keep you in the loop.

And if that isn't enough, we are awaiting final Pennsylvania Fish & Boat Commission approval for the plans for McMichaels Creek near the Monroe County fields near Snydersville. It is a busy time, indeed.

But, you may ask, how does all this relate to Mr. Bradford's quote? Our efforts to restore and enhance the habitat of Pocono Creek required the coordination of efforts between multiple local and state agencies, private corporations, independent contractors and the work and volunteer schedules for our members and friends. Was this easy? Absolutely not. Was it difficult? Sure. But that's what we're here for, to carry out our mission to conserve and protect our coldwater resources. There were times when we could have simply said this is too much. But we persevered and showed the courage necessary to move this forward. I sincerely thank each of you who assisted in every way and I hope to get a personal thank-you out to you soon.



# Pennsylvania's Gas Pipelines Avoiding & Minimizing Impacts on Streams

he Brodhead and Western Pocono Chapters of TROUT UNLIMITED (TU) are proud to announce a unique, jointly-sponsored, program about how TU is working to make sure that impacts from major interstate pipelines on the commonwealth's coldwater streams are avoided or minimized. This innovative program will be offered <a href="#FREE">FREE</a> to the public on Thursday, November 19, 2015 at the Clymer Library, 115 Firehouse Road, Pocono Pines, PA from 6:00-8:00pm. The evening features three members of Trout Unlimited's national staff.

According to the Department of Environmental Protection, Pennsylvania is expected to see up to 27,000 miles of new pipelines by 2030. Katy Dunlap, TU's eastern water project director, will describe Pennsylvania's landscape of proposed major pipelines, potential impacts to water resources and fisheries, and the regulatory framework for major natural gas pipelines. Jake Lemon, TU's eastern shale gas monitoring coordinator, will explain how citizens can play a practical role in watching over coldwater streams by conducting pipeline monitoring before, during and after construction. Paula Piatt, TU's eastern sportsmen organizer, will describe how TU is

working to achieve protective water quality and fisheries designations to ensure that as pipelines are permitted, appropriate conditions are placed on development.

This is a major, cooperative joint venture developed by TU for the benefit of sportsmen and women in the Poconos, as well as surrounding areas. This program represents TROUT UNLIMITED at its best working together to create protection and awareness of conservation of Pocono trout and their vital fresh water habitat.
