Pocono Creek Phase | Completed !

On Thursday and Saturday, June 16 and 18, members of Brodhead TU #289 completed Phase I of the Pocono Creek habitat improvement project in Tannersville, PA. Special thanks to contractor and Brodhead TU friend Bill Hakim for his talented work with the excavator as hundreds of boulders found their way to strategic locations in Pocono Creek on the Pocono Heritage Land Trust (PHLT) tract west of the Old Mill Road bridge. Brodhead TU thanks Bill, PHLT, Northampton Community College and Dr. Matt Connell, Pocono Township, Monroe County County Conservation District, and all our members who carved time out of their schedules to observe, help, and support this effort. Congratulations to all on seeing our plans come to fruition.

Weather and stream conditions provided the opportunity to complete this project as planned. In all, five stone deflectors, a cross-vein, and boulder placements were made. The wait now begins for muchneeded rains that will provide the hydraulic power necessary for increasing depth and current flow.

Brodhead TU will collect data over the next year to observe the effect these devices have on the creek and the brown trout population. These data will be used for future planning and will be shared with our members and the community.

Project Works Complete on Pocono and McMichaels Creeks

Through the efforts of our members and friends, the Pocono Creek Phase I and the McMichaels Creek habitat improvement projects are completed!

On June 18-16, 2016, the boulders stored along the Pocono Creek on the Pocono Heritage Land Trust (PHLT) tract last fall were placed into the creek, creating five deflectors, a cross-vein and boulder placements. These devices will provide increased shelter for the wild brown trout and other organisms that inhabit the creek with the goal of increasing the biomass of wild trout. In areas adjacent to our project area, where boulders create cuts, current seams and depth, trout such as the one below left, photographed this June, can live and thrive. Thank you to Patagonia, PHLT, Pocono Township, Northampton Community College, All Construction and Repair, and our members Eric Baird, Don Baylor, Don Miller, Sam and Russell Thrall, Kathleen Flynn, Jim Connor, Todd Burns, and Jerry Bortz, for your assistance with this project.
