Women in Brodhead TU: Ann Foster has spearheaded the efforts that have culminated with the first "Wine, Women, and Waders" event to be held April 29, 2107 at Mountain View Vineyard. See the flyer on page 6 for all the details. Currently, the class is wait-listed but, fear not, we are looking into holding another event later in the year!

Pocono Creek Phases II-IV (Update): We're in the discussion phase for contractors for boulder movement and placement and we've begun to get landowner approvals. We should have the basics in place by early May so the project can be started after June 15th. With this spring's high waters, the diverters and boulders in Phase I have begun to do their jobs so it will be interesting to see the results as we move into spring and summer.

Pocono Creek Parking Spaces (Reminder) In addition to the signage for the parking areas on the former NCC Campus, Brodhead TU is supporting the construction of a small parking area on the PHLT tract upstream of the Old Mill Road bridge. Working with PHLT to provide this recreational access, we still anticipate work will be completed this summer.

McMichaels Creek Project (Update): The cross vein and boulders in the McMichaels Creek project on the Monroe County Recreation Fields in Snydersville have benefitted from the spring high waters. Cuts have appeared around the sides of the boulders as the current has begun to deepen these areas, creating cover and feeding lanes for trout. The cross vein centered the current flow into the boulders so the latter could go to work.

<u>Cherry Creek Project</u>: On April 6, the BTU Board voted to move forward with funding for our work on the Cherry Creek project. We will be applying for a grant but will fund this up-front so we can avoid any delay. Preliminary plans can be found on page 7. They are subject to change but will give you an idea of what's in store.



Keystone/TU Teens Conservation Summer Camp

Diversity Initiative: The Board discussed creating a guide of public sites for persons requiring specialized access. This would be initial step in addressing the needs of a variety of people who may not know where such access is and how it can be reached. We look to have a table of such sites available within our next newsletter.

Austin Blakeslee Preserve: A partnership among Tobyhanna Township, Pocono Heritage Land Trust, Tobyhanna Conservation Association, Western Pocono Chapter of TU and the Brodhead Chapter of TU is exploring options to improve habitat and fishing opportunities along Tobyhanna Creek within the Preserve. BTU would be looking at 2018 and 2019 for work in this area.

Tom Gilmore Pennsylvania's Blue Ribbon Trout Streams



After almost three decades of service, Tom Gilmore retired in the spring of 2012, as President and CEO of the New Jersey Audubon Society, the oldest and largest conservation organization in the state of New Jersey. During that time, he led the conservation community through numerous extraordinary environmental achievements. It's no surprise that Tom has received numerous awards and honors, including the Conservation Medal from the Daughters of the American Revolution, New Jersey Environmental Lobby's first Environmental Legacy Award, Earth Share's New Jersey's Environmental Stewardship Award, and Trout Unlimited's Crystal Trout Award for Coldwater Conservation and the NY/NJ Baykeeper's Award for Outstanding Public Service..

Tom was recognized by The Star Ledger newspaper (New Jersey's largest daily paper) as Winner of the Year, for his work to save the Highlands. New Jersey Monthly magazine recognized Tom as one the "101 Most Influential People in New Jersey." He was also awarded the Governors Environmental Achievement Award by both Governors Corzine and Christy. Prior to joining New Jersey Audubon, Tom was the Vice President and General Manager of the Philadelphia Zoo.

In addition to being an accomplished environmentalist, Tom is an avid fly fisherman. He has fly fished around the world for over 45 years. Tom is a well know fly fishing celebrity having given well over 100 programs on fly fishing for everything from trout, bonefish, permit, tarpon, billfish and tuna. He is an accomplished author having written numerous articles for Eastern Fly Fishing and Fly Fishing Saltwaters. His fourth book, East Coast Trophy Tailwaters, was published in the fall of 2014. He is currently completing on a comprehensive Pennsylvania trout stream guide which is due out in September 2016.

His first book, False Albacore, was published in 2002, his second book entitled, Tuna on the Fly, was published in the fall of 2006. Tom's third book Flyfisher's Guide to the Big Apple was published in 2011.
