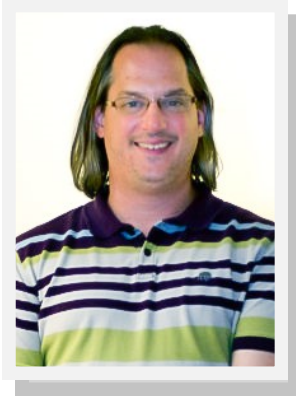

Greetings Members and Friends,

The Chapter had a busy October, but I hope everyone managed to get out and enjoy one of the most spectacular fall color changes we have had in years. We have a full slate of events in November. On November 10, I hope to see many of you at the Blue Ridge Estate and Winery in Saylorsburg for the **Protect the Tap** Celebration of Clean Water. There is no entry fee, and there will be food, games, raffles and more including a casting contest being run by the Chapter. The event lasts from 11 to 4 and proceeds support the educational programs of the Monroe County and Northampton County Conservation Districts. If not, on Wednesday November 14, at our general meeting from 7 to 9 PM at the Kettle Creek Environmental Education Center, we will be in building mode as we construct **used monofilament collection containers** to be installed along public waterways this spring. We'll also have an advocacy update. On the advocacy front we are celebrating a victory as the suit to reduce the protection of several streams in Monroe County has been dismissed, you can read more about that [here](#). I was also elated to find out that many of you were among the more than 120 people who attended the panel discussion on **Clean Streams, the Poconos, and You**. Even with this good news, we must remain vigilant for opponents of clean water have not given up. To that note, the Monroe County Conservation District Board of Directors meets on November 15 at 8 AM at the Kettle Creek Environmental Education Center. The District is the most important regulatory body in Monroe County and your support and advocacy goes a long way to helping the District staff complete that mission.

I was very excited to see so many new faces (plus a lot of familiar ones) last month to hear Adam Nidoh present on the Lackawanna River. I hope to see even more at the events this month. Qualitative Data Derived from Electroshocking Demonstration on Cherry Creek October 19, 2018



On Friday, October 19th, members of Brodhead TU, with the help of Aquatic Consulting Services, conducted an electroshocking demonstration on Cherry Creek within the Cherry Valley National Wildlife Refuge near Stroudsburg, PA. Students from Stroudsburg High School's Environmental Science classes rotated through three stations, one of which was BTU's. Students were able to see wild brown trout, american eels (a true highlight for many students!) and a variety of bait fish appear "out of nowhere" and then disappear just as quickly when released. Although not a quantitative study, this activity provided a qualitative look at what species are present in the creek. And yes, trout were located off the devices installed only months ago. In fact, the lower "stone cross vane with a log-throat" yielded 4 legal-sized brown trout and a nice american eel. Additionally, the brush or "Christmas Tree" diverter housed quite a few baitfish in all its nooks and crannies.



Species observed were: brown trout, american eels, common shiners, black nose dace, white suckers, a tessellated darter, a nice rainbow trout (not wild or native), cutlips minnow, long-nosed dace and a creek chub or two. Not surprisingly, due to the location close to the Delaware River, two rock bass, a small sunfish and a tiny smallmouth bass were also collected.

As per our Embrace-A-Stream grant application, we will be conducting a *quantitative* study in the future to determine the post-project biomass of trout in order to evaluate the effectiveness of the recently added habitat devices. Whereas one of our goals was to utilize this project as an educational resource, we are already successful.



Recent BTU Activities...

Initial Redd Survey Underway

October 20, 2018



Brodhead TU and The Pocono Heritage Land Trust initiated a “Redd Survey” on several local EV and HQ streams. On Saturday, October 20, a volunteer team of six interested citizen scientists visited Yankee Run and Tank Creek within PHLT preserves. Moving along the streams, they recorded the locations of observed trout redds or nests along the stream bottoms. The data were uploaded using the Survey123 app and follow-up visits will be conducted within the next month. Based upon these early observations, spawning may be a bit late this year as water levels have been high and temperatures have suddenly dropped.



Other streams on the potential study list are Cherry Creek, Devil's Hole Creek, and the Brodhead. Check back later for more details!



By the way, the term "redd" according to Google, is derived from the late, Middle English in the sense of "clear space." So, go redd up your room so you can go out and count some trout redds!

NORTHEAST PENNSYLVANIA ENVIRONMENTAL PARTNERS AWARD RECIPIENTS

On **Thursday, October 25, 2018**, at the Woodlands Inn and Resort, the Northeast Environmental Partners (Northeastern Pennsylvania Alliance, Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, Pennsylvania Environmental Council, PPL Corporation, Procter & Gamble Paper Products Company, and Wilkes University) presented awards to individuals and organizations for their outstanding achievements in environmental endeavors.

(Editors Note—Brodhead TU is proud and honored that two of its members received awards: Don Baylor and Craig Todd.)

Don Baylor, for his leading role in various conservation efforts throughout Monroe County. Mr. Baylor partnered with numerous organizations to protect the streams of Monroe County and in turn those of the Delaware River Watershed. He collected biological data, conducted studies for environmental projects, acted as a liaison and facilitator between private groups, environmental organizations and government entities. His service to numerous non-profit organizations has led to collaboration amongst many groups allowing for cross pollination of environmental efforts and greater successes than any of these groups could have achieved individually.

The 24th Annual Thomas P. Shelburne Environmental Leadership Award was presented to Craig Todd. Craig was honored for his more than 35 years of dedication and commitment to the environment. He has spent his entire career working toward protecting the natural resources of Monroe County and northeastern Pennsylvania. His work ethic and drive allowed the Monroe County Conservation District to cooperate with numerous local and state agencies as well as the business community. Throughout his tenure he partnered with organizations to work on protecting the local environment while utilizing smart growth initiatives.

Craig has never wavered in his commitment to soil and water conservation protection while working hand-in-hand with land preservation organizations and government agencies to make the system work better for everyone. He understood that a clean environment would not only benefit the fauna and flora of the region but also the homeowners and businesses that call Monroe County home. His work while at the Conservation District has served as a model for other Conservation Districts within the state as well as for state and federal conservation partners. He has been instrumental in preserving the sensitive resources in Monroe County while advocating for economic growth in compliance with environmental regulations.

Craig initiated conservation partnerships, worked cooperatively with conservation partners at all levels, and was instrumental in protecting the resources of Monroe County, the Delaware River Basin, and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. He led projects and initiatives that changed the way conservation practices are carried out on all levels. Under his tenure he worked locally with other agencies in Monroe County on planning, agricultural land and open space preservation, stormwater management, water quality studies, litter control and beautification, and worked with businesses and economic development organizations to promote smart growth and development while maintaining a strong and compliant resource conservation program.

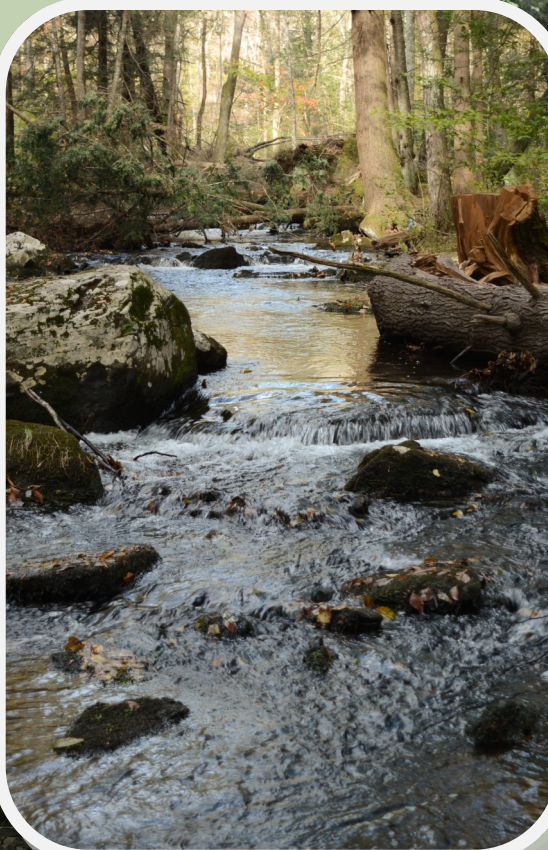
Clean Streams, the Poconos, and You

BTU Activities...Fishing Report

If you're an angler, we understand your frustration with the recent weather we've had. We think the trout in our cold-water streams feel the same frustration. To spawn or not to spawn, that is the question!

With that being said, members report that when the flows are down, the fishing has been quite good. If you go out, please be careful where you wade so you don't destroy or degrade any spawning redds. Also, remember to wear fleece as it will keep you warm if you get wet. All information below is from public-access waters.

Brodhead Creek along the various public access points has produced some nice rainbows and some wild browns. Fish have been topwater feeding at times but be prepared to "go small" in hook sizes. The Brodhead can get "big" when the water is up so be careful wading and take a wading staff with you.

McMichaels Creek has also been producing wild browns and some stocked rainbows. When the water is up, go with some small zonker-style streamers and when it drops, revert back to some smaller nymphs.



Reports from **Pocono Creek** indicate the wild browns are doing well and are hitting a variety of flies. Although the deeper holes are attractive and hold fish, nice browns can still be found around stream side habitats such as logs, willows, and cut-outs around boulders.



Devil's Hole Creek, like our other streams, has been experiencing a roller coaster ride when it comes to flows. Get it on the right day and you'll swear somebody just stocked it. Get there under the wrong conditions and you'll be coming after me for even mentioning the stream!

Martin's Creek browns are active and the water is a bit warmer than those of northern Pocono waters. It also has run-off a bit faster so don't be surprised if it's a bit lower than expected when you arrive. Again, nymph fishing has been successful.



Some of the wild browns being caught show signs of being post-spawn. When you land a sizeable fish that is strong but "empty", chances are milt or eggs have already been deposited and this fish is looking to stock up on some calories prior to the winter months. Good luck, tight lines, and carefully release those wild fish!

DID YOU KNOW?

The **Stroud Water Research Center** (<https://stroudcenter.org/>) is a leading scientific research agency studying freshwater ecosystems across the globe. One of their many projects includes **monitoring the effects of road salt** applications in freshwater streams and rivers within the Delaware River watershed. (<https://stroudcenter.org/news/envirodiy-sensors-track-road-salt/>) Whereas the greater Pocono region has harsh winters and thousands of miles of streams and roads, **Brodhead TU will be reaching out** to the center to see how we can become actively involved in this ongoing research.



Dr. Paul Wilson, from East Stroudsburg University, currently has two water monitoring stations on Cherry Creek within the Cherry Valley National Wildlife Refuge. One of the factors being monitored is **conductivity**, which is a function of the dissolved ions in the water (road salts would be a contributor). You can view that data [here](#) and [here](#). You can check historical data for the past year and zoom in to see the relationship between stream flow and conductivity.

Additionally, the Brodhead Chapter will be requesting information from the state and our local municipalities as to what products they purchase to treat roads for winter use. This will allow us to ascertain to what extent certain products such as salts, tailings, and crushed stone are used in the greater Pocono area.



Through monitoring and continued research, the true extent of the effect in our area can be determined and appropriate mitigation efforts researched and devised, if needed.

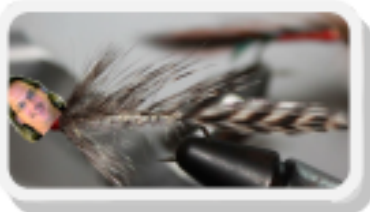
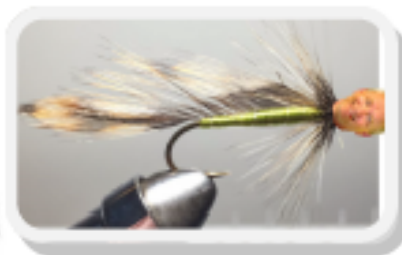

News Notes, Advocacy Opportunities, and Items of Interest:

State update.

HB 254 would roll back conventional oil & gas regulations. It was voted out of the Senate Appropriations committee. At last count, there were 26 confirmed “NO” commitments from senators. We are not in favor of a roll-back of regulations.

Federal update.

DRBRP funding –Congress passed a continuing resolution (CR) in late September, giving them until December 7th to act (They could also pass another continuing resolution.)

Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) Update – The LWCF expired on September 30th. However, the House Committee on Natural Resources and the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee both approved a bill that would permanently reauthorize the Fund. The Senate bill also includes language that would provide permanent funding at \$900 million, while the House bill does not. Congress must negotiate the language and may approve the bill within the lame duck session.

Earlier this week, President Trump signed America's Water Infrastructure Act of 2018. This Act:

- Increases State Revolving Fund (SRF) monies from \$1 billion to \$1.95 billion in 2021
- Reauthorizes the Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (WIFIA)
- Increases the amount of SRF funds that can be sent to economically disadvantaged communities and increases the repayment period by 10 years
- Creates a grant program for lead-free school drinking water fountains

They provide technical services for stormwater management, erosion and sediment control, wetlands and watershed protection, land use planning, the dirt & gravel low volume roads program (very important, by the way) and more. 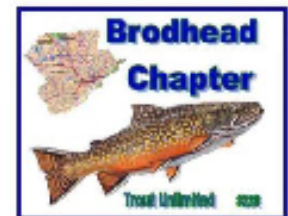
- **PA Fish & Boat Commission: Additions to Wild Trout Stream Listings & other Rulemakings**

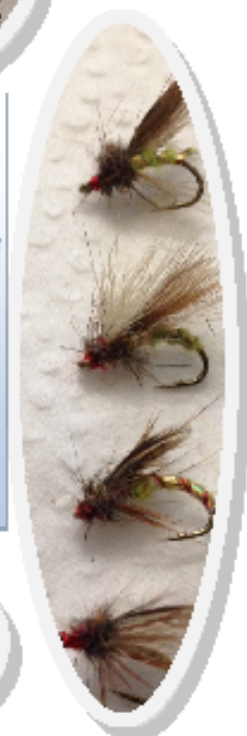

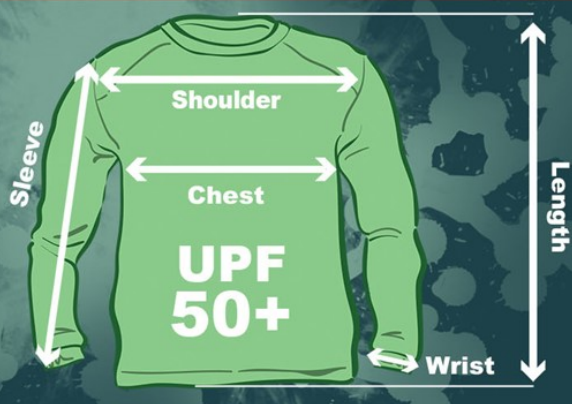

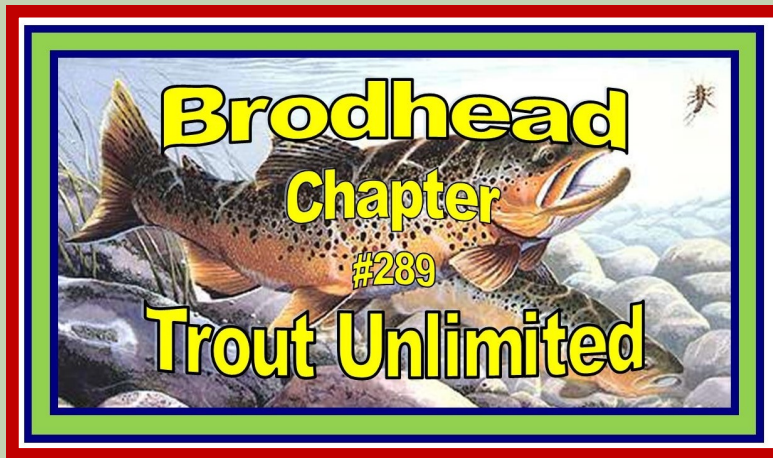
