# The Dam Removal Process Explained



On Thursday, October 9, 2019, Jessie Thomas-Blate of <u>American Rivers</u> will be speaking on the process and procedures for removing a dam from a river or stream. With many old, unused industrial dams currently in place that serve to block the free movement of trout into spawning areas, the dam removal process plays an important part in reconnecting trout habitats—a part of TU's mission.

Jessie is an Associate Director of River Restoration at American Rivers, a national environmental organization focused on protecting and restoring rivers across the country. Since 2010, Jessie has been working with partners across the country on a variety of river restoration and protection work— from advocacy and outreach to coordination with local communities to restore and protect their rivers and streams. Jessie manages river restoration projects throughout the mid-Atlantic region, and provides advice to local individuals and communities interested in dam removal. Prior to her work at American Rivers, Jessie worked for the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission, Atlantic Coastal Fish Habitat Partnership, and Natural Resources Defense Council. Jessie has a B.S. in Biology from Mary Washington College, and an M.S. in Natural Resources from Delaware State University. She lives in Virginia with her husband, 7-year old, and sweet old dog.

# Pocono Creek Project—Phase IV Completed

On Thursday, September 26, 2019, Board members Jeff Heberley, Don Baylor, and Todd Burns directed the placement of boulders to complete the Phase IV Pocono Creek Habitat Improvement Project. This potion of the project was made possible with the help of the <u>Brodhead Creek Regional Authority</u> (BCRA) and <u>Pocono Heritage Land Trust (PHLT</u>) and we thank those organizations, along with <u>Pocono Township</u> and our members Jeff Heberley and Don Miller for their efforts in seeing this to completion.

Boulders were placed from just upstream of the footbridge on the old Tannersville Elementary School site to downstream of the foul pole on the baseball field. These boulders will create more habitat by providing cover and forcing the high waters deeper, thereby forming better holding and feeding stations for the wild brown and native brook trout in the stream. If nature accommodates our wishes, we'll have enough high water this winter and spring to see the effects as early as next year.

Stop on by and check it out but be careful as it may still be a construction zone! Below you will find some photos of the day's work.

# **Fishing Report**

If you've been out an about you'll know that stream flows are extraordinarily low. Cool nights are helping in keeping the O2 levels high enough for our brookies, browns, and rainbows but we need rain and lots of it. With spawning season coming up quickly, it is our suggestion you give the trout in the smaller streams a break—they need it. November and December are historically wet months so if we get the water table up and the streams get somewhat "normal", we'll start providing some reports and updates.

In the meantime, if you're not heading into the woods to hunt, you can always head out to the local lakes and ponds to fish for the "Pocono Package" of bluegills, largemouth bass, perch, and chain pickerel. They're fun, there are lots of them and they like cold water, too. Locally, we have public access at Tobyhanna Lake, Gouldsboro Lake, Hidden Lake, and the Upper and Lower Promised Land Lakes. Plus, there are many development ponds out there. It's a great way to see the fall scenery and practice your casting. You may be surprised at how accurate you need to be on a pond!
