There are some advocacy items to watch for in the coming weeks, the PA Fish and Boat Commission just released a new list of streams that are slated to be considered Wild Trout Stream and Class A Wild Trout Streams. We also are asking our friends and members to keep a close idea on the State budget as it works its way through the legislature to make sure that environmental programs are not taking a lion share of the cuts that are going to be required to balance the budget.

<u>Comment Period Closing Soon</u>: On February 8, a comment period opened regarding additional listings or reclassifications to Wild Trout Waters and Class A Wild Trout Waters. The listings and links to make comments can be found <u>here</u>. *This comment period closes on March 10, 2021*. Don't be shy about commenting !

<u>Nurdles!</u> Remember those untold number of little plastic polyethylene pellets that spilled into Sand Spring Run and came hurling down through Pocono Creek? The ones that are still found along the creek, miles downstream? Well, March 31 represents the three year anniversary of that spill and we'll be revisiting that event in the April 2021 newsletter.

PA Legislative News:

The 2021 Legislative Session is open and committees in both the House and Senate are up and running. Brodhead Creek was very cold. But reports of nice brown trout taken on streamers are filtering out. Streamers, representing forage fish, offer a trout the promise of lots of (precious) winter calories and they aren't likely to let one pass by without a look. Black, white and olive are good starting colors.



McMichaels Creek produced some nice trout through the middle of February. Nymphs tied on jigging or standard hooks fished deep attracted some nice fish. Middle of the day seemed to be the best as the fish seemed the most active then. Access is found within the Stroudsburg/East Stroudsburg corridor at various parks as Monroe County and Stroud Township parks.

Pocono Creek was its typical self: alternating between demanding and, well, not as demanding. When the water was low, small nymphs and chironomid patterns worked and when there was some water, bugger-type streamers attracted attention.



Tributaries - Young of year fry are now out so watch where you step. Fishing can be loads of fun in these streams but access due to snow can be a bit of a challenge. Be careful.

Martins Creek ran rather low in February. The cold weather kept the snow from melting but prior to closing on February 15, there were some little black stoneflies out and about. Holdover rainbows and browns were a big sluggish but if you got your offering close, they'd take it. Small, dark beadhead nymphs were successful.

Lackawanna and Delaware River:s Lots of fish in the Lackawanna and upper Delaware. Flows here are really important to know so please check the USGS gauges on-line before you head out.

Committee Updates

Brodhead TU has several active committees focused upon meeting the needs identified in our Strategic Plan. If you would like to volunteer to serve on one of these committees, please contact a Board member at your convenience. Below are brief descriptions of what each committee does and some actions they have recently undertaken.

Advocacy— Advocacy alerts members of upcoming policy and/or legislative changes that can impact the cold-water resources in the Poconos, the state, and the nation. It provides information and recommendations regarding policy and legislation and encourages members to communicate with the appropriate departments and elected officials. Recent advocacy efforts focused upon identification and listing of new Class A and Wild Trout waters. This is important because such listings provide increased protections for the waterways. See the Advocacy page for more information.

Diversity Initiative— Focuses upon strengthening the chapter by providing information and activities that will attract and retain members across the spectrum found within our communities. Recent efforts involve folding our current veteran's initiatives into this area. This will provide greater flexibility in providing programming specific to needs of the community. Stay tuned as this is just getting underway.

Fundraising— The fundraising committee looks at developing and maintaining revenue streams sufficient to meet the Chapter's financial needs. The chapter recently began an on-line donation program to fund habitat work on McMichaels Creek within the Pomeroy Preserve. This campaign will continue throughout the year. A QR code now appears within the newsletter that will allow donors to quickly donate to the project. Additionally, three grant opportunities are being explored that could greatly assist in funding the habitat improvements. Finally, look for an upcoming on-line auction or two (woo hoo!) where you can bid on items from the comfort of your own home.

Conservation— This group works on stream or habitat improvement projects. The committee works with local conservation groups such as Pocono Heritage Land Trust, the Brodhead Water-shed Association, Friends of Cherry Valley and local governing bodies to improve the existing cold-water resources to enhance the wild trout fisheries. Two new projects include improvements in the Upper Paradise watershed tributaries (Tank Creek and Yankee Run) and work within the Pomeroy Preserve on McMichaels Creek. Current plans are to use the Chop and Drop techniques to add woody material to the creeks to improve habitat for trout and macroinvertebrates.

Tree Planting- A sub-committee of the Conservation Committee, this new group is focused upon identifying areas within our community that will benefit from tree plantings and enacting plans to put trees in the ground. Recent activities include planning site visits to potential planting sites at the end of March. Once sites are selected, appropriate types of trees will be ordered and projects coordinated with the landowners. At that point, a call will go out for volunteers to get those trees in the ground.

We Need Your Financial Support for our Stream Restoration Campaign

The Brodhead Chapter of Trout Unlimited needs your help to restore trout habitat in our Pocono streams

In 2022, Brodhead TU plans to start construction on a \$75,000 project to improve in-stream habitat on nearly ³/₄ of a mile of McMichael's Creek. Located within the Pocono Heritage Land Trust's recently established Pomeroy Preserve, adjacent to Hickory Valley Park, this stream section is part of the PA Fish & Boat Commission's Keystone Select Trophy Trout/Delayed Harvest program and offers

public access and year-round fishing opportunities.

As beautiful as this section of creek is, in-stream habitat is limited, and will benefit greatly from Brodhead TU's science-based habitat restoration work. The Chapter's past projects on the Brodhead Creek, Cherry Creek, McMichael's

Creek and Pocono Creek resulted in improvements in the ability of trout to reproduce and flourish. This restoration project will do the same.




