## Brodhead TU STREAM Girls Event Completed

July 2021

STREAM Girls - Science, Technology, Recreation, Engineering, Arts, Math - is a <u>Trout Unlimited watershed program</u> for girls, designed to break down barriers in science education and the outdoors. Brodhead Chapter 289 held its first Stream Girls event late this spring at <u>Hickory Run State Park</u>, partnering with the <u>PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources</u>, Hickory Run State Park environmental educators, and the <u>Girl Scouts of America</u>.



These young women worked together to calculate stream flow, flipped rocks to gather and identify macro-invertebrates and discovered and explored stream and riparian features. They also went on a 'stream walk ,'tied woolly buggers, practiced fly casting, and learned about the history of Hickory Run State Park. TU volunteers for the day included a chemist, biochemist, research nurse, wet-lands biologist and an environmental educator. The adults had as good a time as the Scouts and they can't wait for next year!

TU's National Leadership Council's Diversity & Inclusion workgroup endeavors to build a more diverse membership and leadership, while creating a welcoming and inclusive culture at every level of TU. The STREAM Girls program is but one path to that end and Brodhead TU is proud to participate. With the Recreational Boating and Fishing Foundation reporting that 31% of fly anglers are women, it is important to note that women compose 6% of Trout Unlimited's membership. That is a gap we hope the Stream Girls program will help to close.

We are still working on a tree planting day this fall along with some other volunteer





# **Brodhead TU Summer-Slam Auction**



Brodhead TU will be conducting an on-line auction August 15 through September 4, 2021. Proceeds from the auction will go toward the major habitat improvements to be installed in 2022-2023 on McMichaels Creek within the Pomeroy Nature Preserve, upstream of Hickory Valley Park. Brodhead TU is working with the Pocono Heritage Land Trust and the Pennsylvania Fish & Boat Commission to provide much-needed trout habitat in this section of McMichaels Creek.

The chapter will be offering a handcrafted, 7 1/2' bamboo fly rod (*above left*) with

case and rod sock, original works of art and prints (*right, below left*), boxes of quality, locally-tied flies (*below right*) several "Days on the Stream" on local waterways and more. Additional information and photos of other items will be forthcoming as we approach the auction opening. Mark the dates on your

## **Committee Updates**

Brodhead TU has several active committees focused upon meeting the needs identified in our Strategic Plan. If you would like to volunteer to serve on one of these committees, please contact a Board member at your convenience. Below are brief descriptions of what each committee does and some actions they have recently undertaken.

**Advocacy**— Advocacy alerts members of upcoming policy and/or legislative changes that can impact the cold-water resources in the Poconos, the state, and the nation. Legislation that heads through the House and Senate in Harrisburg has the potential to directly or indirectly affect the coldwater fisheries throughout the state. See page 7 for more details.

**Diversity Initiative**— Focuses upon strengthening the chapter by providing information and activities that will attract and retain members across the spectrum found within our communities. The Chapter is currently advertising TU National's Harassment Policy and providing a link for reporting of harassing activities. This is a vital step in creating and maintaining an atmosphere that welcomes all persons interested in BTU's activities.

**Fundraising**— Plans continue for the on-line auction scheduled for August 15-September 4, 2021. The auction pages are being created and prizes gathered. We've got a hand-crafted bamboo fly rod, multiple days on local streams (some guided) Don Baylor paintings, an original graphite drawing by Haley Burns, large boxes of locally tied flies, a wooden fly box and more. The Chapter's application for a TU Embrace-A-Stream is completed and ready to submit prior to July 15. Keep your fingers crossed! BTU also applied for a PFBC Cooperative Habitat Improvement Project (CHIP) grant with the PFBC and have been notified those funds will be available in 2022/2023.

**Conservation**— This group works on stream or habitat improvement projects. Two new projects include improvements in the Upper Paradise watershed tributaries (Tank Creek and Yankee Run) and work within the Pomeroy Preserve on McMichaels Creek. Site plans for the McMichael Creek/Pomeroy Preserve project will be available this August.

**Tree Planting–** After making multiple site visits, the committee narrowed down the possible work sites. At present, locations along Middle Creek in Polk Township and Cherry Creek at the Josie Porter Farm are high-priority locations. Committee members are planning additional meetings with the appropriate parties for these locations in order to determine what is needed and to coordinate cohesive plans. Once sites and plans are finalized, appropriate types of trees will be ordered. At that point, a call will go out for volunteers to get those trees in the ground!

# **Mid-Summer Fishing Outlook**

## Summer Pocono Hatches & Fishing Update

It's been awfully warm the last few weeks and the stream temperatures have gradually crept upward. In addition, those cold, head-water streams are very low and natural predation (by mink, otters, herons, etc.) will increase with fewer escape paths available. We encourage you to read the caution shown below and to give the trout a rest when they need it. If we get some rain and cooler weather...

Expect to see some yellow sallies (yellow stoneflies) in those good, cold tributaries. They flit about and through the sunbeams shining through the forest canopy and trout do like them. A pale yellow, dry caddis pattern can work if you don't have any sallies tied up. A size 16 is a good starting point. On rainy mornings, expect to see some cornutas or blue-winged olives. Trout love to line up in the current seams to munch on these mayflies. Size 14 is a good place to start. Also in the mayfly realm, pack some lsonychia or Slate Drake patterns. We see several broods of these mayflies throughout the year and most fall within the size 12 – size 14 category. Finally, don't be afraid to throw some size 16 or size 18 ants of various colors in your box. Black, red and brown should cover most of what falls into the water.

## **CAUTION:**

While trout will tolerate warmer water temperatures for short periods of time, they function and survive best in water temperatures below **68 degrees F**. Trout will begin to experience stress above this point and will eventually slow down and/or stop feeding if temperatures remain too high. Any additional stress caused by overplaying a fish under these conditions can be lethal to the trout. Please carry a stream thermometer and refrain from trout fishing in waters with temperatures above the **68** degree mark.

In 2022, Brodhead TU plans to start construction on a \$75,000 project to improve in-stream habitat on nearly <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of a mile of McMichael's Creek. Located within the Pocono Heritage Land Trust's recently established Pomeroy Preserve, adjacent to Hickory Valley Park, this stream section is part of the PA Fish & Boat Commission's Keystone Select Trophy Trout/Delayed Harvest program and offers

public access and year-round fishing opportunities.

As beautiful as this section of creek is, in-stream habitat is limited, and will benefit greatly from Brodhead TU's science-based habitat restoration work. The Chapter's past projects on the Brodhead Creek, Cherry Creek, McMichael's

Creek and Pocono Creek resulted in improvements in the ability of trout to reproduce and flourish. This restoration project will do the same.




