As I write this, the chapter's stream habitat restoration project at the Pocono Heritage Land Trust (PHLT) Pomeroy McMichaels Creek Nature Preserve is well underway. Our partners at the Pennsylvania Fish & Boat Commission (PFBC) and volunteers from the chapter began work on phase I of the project on October 2. By the end of the first week, they had several deflectors installed and parts of other devices. In-stream work will continue through October 12-13th.

The chapter partnered a few years ago with PHLT and PFBC to plan and raise funds to help improve trout habitat on this section of the McMichaels with public access near Stroudsburg. The preserve is upstream of and adjoins Stroud Township's Hickory Valley Park where the chapter did restoration work a little over a decade ago.

The project wouldn't have been possible without the financial support we've received from ourmembers, friends and the many volunteers who have taken time to help with planning and the on-site work.

A special shout out goes to Todd Burns, our board member and a past president of the chapter, who has been onsite every day so far keeping the project moving with our partners at PHLT and PFBC and our contractor Papillion & Moyer Excavating.

The chapter plans to hold a hike at the preserve on November 11 to show off the project.

Pomeroy-McMichaels Creek

Project Update #2

The Pomeroy-McMichaels Creek project started on October 2 and is proceeding nicely. Due to increases in transportation and fuel costs, the extent of the project has been scaled back but we look to have seven structures built to improve an area that suffers from a lack of good trout habitat. As stated before, the purpose of these constructions is to provide much-needed habitat for wild and stocked

trout. Build it and they will come.

These devices will also narrow the stream width and increase stream velocity. Habitat in such waters will enhance the macroinvertebrate populations. As we stated last month, we're looking to give the trout some shelter and additional food. With these improvements, the expectation is that year-round trout population will increase, thereby providing an improved angling experience. Approximately I year after completion, we'll electrofish

the work area to assess the results of

our efforts.



lenge, special donations and an initial start-up as seed money.



News Notes, Advocacy Opportunities, and Items of Interest



BTU Position Statement on Distribution Centers/Warehouse Construction

Discussions are being carried out concerning the construction of distribution centers throughout the Pocono region. Proposed projects are in various stages of planning, review, comment and hearings in Coolbaugh Township, Tunkhannock Township and Pocono Township. Potentially affected streams and their associated wetlands and tributaries are Mud Pond Run, Pocono Creek and Tobyhanna Creek.

BTU understands warehouse development will occur, and it believes that such development must be done in areas that do not impact the absorption, retention, filtration and free movement of rain water and other precipitation near cold-water resources. It should not reduce the size or quality of wetlands, provide damaging thermal and/or saline stress due to runoff, or cause increased siltation in our streams. The cold, clean trout waters for which the Poconos is known should not be degraded and BTU is willing to work with residents and local governments to achieve this goal.



House Bill 1300

There is an amendment attached to this Bill that would transfer \$150,000,000 from the Pennsylvania Game Commission to the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission Clean Stream Funds. The Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission does not support this move which could make the Pennsylvania Game Commission unable to financially support its mission, and rob the Commission of the federal matching of nearly \$42,000,000 from the Pittman-Robertson Act. Trout Unlimited asks that the HB 1300 not pass with this amendment. Contact your State Representative immediately and let them know your feelings on HB 1300.

Hawthorne Inn Site Development.

The proposed development of the former Hawthorne Inn site was approved by the Paradise Township Supervisors after a series of public, conditional use hearings. Numerous conditions were included in conjunction with the approval. The site development has potential impacts on Indian Run and Swiftwater Creek, headwaters of the Brodhead Creek. What better way to introduce an October fishing outlook than with a photo of a classic, Gray Ghost streamer. Originally tied in the early 20th century by Carrie Stevens of Maine, this fly has spread throughout the world and has proven to be an effective pattern for a variety of fish. But it's fame was derived from its ability to catch large, native Brook Trout.

So why use this as an introduction to the October fishing outlook? Well, our resident trout are stocking up on calories for the winter and that means they want the most calories for their efforts. The best way to do that is to feed on larger prey like small fish. Hence, now is a great time to break out those streamer patterns you've been lugging around for six months!

Fall trout can strike such an offering quickly and with amazing force so don't be surprised if you get a jolt that almost takes the rod from your hand. Use tippets 3x or heavier, depending upon the size of your fly. Classic streamers such as these and woolly buggers can really produce some nice fish.

Our streams currently have good flows and you can fish your streamers in a down and across manner with a variety of strips as you make your retrieve. You can also fish it up and across, let it sink some more, and do some slow twitching or jigging—simulating an injured bait fish struggling to move. Either method can work so try a little of both.

We are heading into spawning season so please be careful if you fish streams with reproducing populations of trout. Look for "cleaned", oval areas in the tail-outs of pools—these are likely spawning redds of brown or brook trout so please stay clear. And, of course, don't target a fish sitting on a redd.

Good luck and give those streamers a try.




