

Fly-Tying Classes Set to Start

The Brodhead Chapter #289 Trout Unlimited is holding an introduction to fly tying class starting on Saturday, January 6, 2024. Sessions will be held on six Saturdays in January and February at the Brodhead Creek Heritage Center in Analomink, PA. Enrollees will learn basic fly-tying techniques and learn to tie five different local patterns. The necessary skills and techniques learned will sequentially build upon each other as the course progresses and prior lessons will be reinforced throughout.

The six-week class costs \$25 for Trout Unlimited members and \$40 for non-members and includes a one-year membership to Trout Unlimited. Signup fees include all tying materials for the class. Equipment can be rented for an additional \$5 with a \$20 dollar deposit returned when you return the equipment.

Chapter Volunteers Remove Invasive Plants Near Cherry Creek

The afternoon of Sunday, November 19, saw BTU volunteers once again tackle the invasive plants along Cherry Creek in the Cherry Valley National Wildlife Refuge. Working within the "Larsen Tract" west of S.R. 191, the seven member team cut and treated stands of multiflora rose, several species of decorative olives and vines. Previous work done in April of this year and sessions last year provided a good starting point for this year's work. Progress is now evident and with good turnout in future sessions, the Chapter expects the results of the efforts to accelerate. If you can make it next time, come on out. The more volunteers on

site, the faster (and easier!) the work is.



News Notes, Advocacy Opportunities, and Items of Interest

BTU Position Statement on Distribution Centers/Warehouse Construction

Discussions are being carried out concerning the construction of distribution centers throughout the Pocono region. Proposed projects are in various stages of planning, review, comment and hearings in Coolbaugh Township, Tunkhannock Township and Pocono Township. Potentially affected streams and their associated wetlands and tributaries are Mud Pond Run, Pocono Creek and Tobyhanna Creek.

BTU understands warehouse development will occur, and it believes that such development must be done in areas that do not impact the absorption, retention, filtration and free movement of rain water and other precipitation near cold-water resources. It should not reduce the size or quality of wetlands, provide damaging thermal and/or saline stress due to runoff, or cause increased siltation in our streams. The cold, clean trout waters for which the Poconos is known should not be degraded and BTU is willing to work with residents and local governments to achieve this goal.

In Case You Missed it...

Here is the updated link to the **PFBC Regulatory Changes** page so you can review these and other proposals and leave a comment. This month there are new proposed additions to the Class A Trout Streams and Wild Trout Streams lists. Locally, Mud Run is in the proposal for Wild Trout Waters! Please follow the link above and submit comments in favor of placing these streams on their respective lists. Being identified as Class A or Wild Trout provides additional protections for the identified streams. Comment period ends December 18, 2023. The email address is: **RA-pfbcregulations@pa.gov**. Just be sure to identify which proposal you are commenting upon. (Class A Wild Trout or Wild Trout).

Happy December!

It's the last month of 2023, we're in the midst of the holiday and year-end seasons, and you will probably want to take a mental break and do some fishing. So, what's the outlook? Based upon current and projected stream and weather conditions, the outlook is good.

We've had some rain and there is more in the forecast. This has brought stream levels up a bit and they should stay there for the next two-three weeks. Also, air temperatures are staying above freezing and that will keep the water "warmer" as we head into true winter. Decent flows and warmer temperatures mean the fish should be active.

There may still be some trout spawning activity as you head out, especially in those headwater streams. Be careful where you walk and if you're in an area open to hunting, please wear some blaze orange.

Pictured above are three flies that can be fished in tandem throughout the winter months. The bushy dry is designed to suspend the other two, but occasionally you'll get a strike on it. The brown nymph (#18-#16) and the purple chironomid (#16-#18) can be rotated in the middle and bottom positions. Caution: casting a three-fly tandem can be a tangling experience. Try to slow down your cast and/ or use a slower rod to keep a more open loop. If that looks like a bit too much, simply fish a dry-dropper with either the nymph or chironomid on the bottom, some 15" to 18" below the dry. (If you're hitting deeper waters, extend the length of the dropper line and use a larger nymph to get down quicker.) If you're Euro-nymphing, feel free to use a Perdigon to "get em down."

As always, streamers can also produce at this time of year. A slow, jigging style retrieve will often prod a trout into action. If you really, really want to dry fly fish in the winter, you can. But be prepared to go small in the #20-#24 range for midges and the like.

You don't need to hit the streams at the break of dawn in the winter as mid-day is often when the water warms a bit and the trout feed. Remember to dress warmly, tell someone where you're going, and be careful wading.
