

Public Hearing: Chapter 105 Orchard BJK "Lot I" Development in Coolbaugh Township

Tuesday, December 17, 2024 6:00 PM to 9:00 PM

#### Tobyhanna Elementary Center 398 Old Rte. 940 Pocono Pines, PA 18350

On July 26, 2024, the Department of Environmental Protection (PA DEP) received a Water Obstruction and Encroachment Joint Permit application for a utility crossing associated with the Pocono Mountains Corporate Center North Warehouse, Tobyhanna, PA, in Coolbaugh Township, Monroe County. Written public comments were received during an initial comment period. The Department is now conducting a public hearing to accept additional comments on the documentation and plans associated with this permit application. The plans involve the following receiving watercourses:

Hawkey Run (HQ-CWF, MF)

Duck Puddle Run (HQ-CWF, MF)

Exceptional Value (EV) Wetlands associated with above waterways.

It is recommended that testimony is limited to the permit being heard and the impacts associated with that permit such as:

- 1) Functions and values of the waters and wetlands to be impacted and
- 2) What would be considered adequate mitigation.(Any feasible alternatives such as routing the utilities along the 611 corridor for example that have not been adequately explored or not adequately dismissed.)

#### IF YOU WISH TO TESTIFY AT THE HEARING:

Written copies of oral testimony are requested by the Department. Individuals must submit a written notice of intent to: Colleen Connolly at <a href="mailto:coconnolly@pa.gov">coconnolly@pa.gov</a>. The Department will accept requests up to the day of the hearing. Additionally, the Department requests that individuals limit their testimony to 5 minutes so that all individuals have the opportunity to testify.

# Coming in 2025

Looking ahead to 2025, Brodhead TU looks to continue and or expand its activities throughout the greater Pocono area. These include:

- Assisting with the Knights of Columbus' annual fishing derby on Opening Day.
- Completing additional habitat improvements along Yankee Run in Pocono Heritage Land Trust's Yankee Run Preserve.
- Monitoring past habitat work on McMichaels Creek and Pocono Creek.
- Removing invasive plants along Cherry Creek in the Cherry Valley National Wildlife Refuge.
- Planting native species in riparian areas along Cherry Creek in the Cherry Valley National Wildlife Refuge..
- Advocating for the protection of Exceptional Value (EV) and High Quality (HQ) cold-water fisheries throughout the Poconos.
- Working collaboratively with organizations such as Brodhead Watershed Association, Pocono Heritage Land Trust, US Fish and Wildlife Service, PA Fish & Boat and others.
- Holding monthly meetings open to the public.
- Raise funds to support our advocacy, education and habitat improvement activities.

This is a busy agenda but one we've been building for some time. There will probably be additional activities as opportunities and ideas arise throughout the year. We thank you for your past support and look forward to your assistance in the future. Working together, we can make great things happen.



# News Notes, Advocacy Opportunities, and Items of Interest



#### BTU Position Statement on Distribution Centers/Warehouse Construction

Discussions are being carried out concerning the construction of distribution centers throughout the Pocono region. Proposed projects are in various stages of planning, review, comment and hearings in Coolbaugh Township, Tunkhannock Township and Pocono Township. Potentially affected streams and their associated wetlands and tributaries are Mud Pond Run, Pocono Creek and Tobyhanna Creek.

BTU understands warehouse development will occur, and it believes that such development must be done in areas that do not impact the absorption, retention, filtration and free movement of rain water and other precipitation near cold-water resources. It should not reduce the size or quality of wetlands, provide damaging thermal and/or saline stress due to runoff, or cause increased siltation in our streams. The cold, clean trout waters for which the Poconos is known should not be degraded and BTU is willing to work with residents and local governments to achieve this goal.

### **Proposed Removal of Lower Woods Pond Big Bass Program**

Comments may be submitted by mail to: Executive Director, Fish and Boat Commission, P.O. Box 67000, Harrisburg, PA 17106-7000, within 30 days after publication of the notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Electronic submission can be made to RA-pfbcregulations@pa.gov. As before, just be sure to identify which proposal you are commenting upon.

#### **Change In Method to Comment On Proposed Regulatory Changes**

Until the end of 2023, PFBC accepted comments on upcoming regulatory proposals through email and a web-based application, in addition to regular mail. Moving forward, comments will need to be made via mail or the email RA-pfbcregulations@pa.gov . The proposed regulations are still posted on line for your review **BUT** they are on the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* site. To review the proposed changes, you will need to navigate by following the steps below:

- 1. Click on this **Pennsylvania Bulletin link**.
- 2. Under "BULLETIN", select the most recent volume.
- 3. Select the most recent issue(s).
- 4. Select "Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission" from the menu. You will see any pending proposals as a hyperlink
- 5. Select the proposal and it should open so you can read it.

In the past few weeks, we've had some snow, some rain, and a bit more snow. We've had a brief bit of deep freeze and are heading to a week of "warmer" and maybe wet weather. It's been a bit crazy and that makes for some unique decisions regarding fishing.

We've seen quite a few redds out there so the trout were able to find some areas in which to spawn. Be advised there will still be some late-spawning trout in our streams and the redds of those past spawners will still be visible so please be careful ifyou wade. However, from our observations, most of our trout have spawned and have moved to other locations. A little less to worry about.

The big issue we will probably be dealing with for a while is the volume of water in our streams. They are remarkably low and we would urge you to fish in streams that have decent flows or wait until some rain and/or snowmelt replenishes flows a bit.

So, when you find some decently flowing water and avoid the redds, what should be on the end of your line? Some folks swear by their favorite streamer pattern(s) while others are just as adamant in using small nymphs. Under the anticipated conditions in December, fish what you are most comfortable with and, perhaps, downsize a bit If you fish a #6 streamer, go to a #8 or #10. If it's a small nymph, go from a #16 to a #18. or #20.

If you don't like fishing in the cold, ties some flies or clean your gear and get ready for late winter and spring. If you go out, be prepared for the elements and the unexpected. Be careful our there!


