# "Seven Mysteries of the Devil's Hole—Folklore, Tales and Legends"

Wednesday, March 12 at 7 PM Brodhead Creek Heritage Center Analomink, PA

Devils Hole Creek in Monroe County is renowned for its wild trout. However, there are many other fascinating



features fishermen, hikers and outdoor enthusiasts may encounter that make Devils Hole unique. Devils Hole exhibits mystery and mystique, including several building ruins, exciting waterfalls, an elk farm, peculiar artifacts, and remnants from the 1955 flood. Bill Leonard will present a public program entitled "Seven Mysteries of Devils Hole - Folklore, Tales, and Legends."

Bill is a native of Tobyhanna, PA, and his family, along with the Coolbaugh Township Historical Association, have held the Annual Tobyhanna Millpond #I Ice Harvest since 1994. He is an avid fly fisherman and hunter. Much of his hunting is on the former Tobyhanna Military Reservation, now State Game Lands #127, and while wandering about pursuing game, he searches for remnants of 19th century logging operations, the ice industry, and former military activities.

Bill retired from the National Park Service in April 2016 as the Deputy Superintendent of the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area. He also served a six-month period as Acting Superintendent of Steamtown National His-



toric Site. Before coming to the National Park Service, he was the Facilities Engineer at the Tobyhanna Army Depot. He graduated from Pocono Central Catholic School in 1974 and went on to Penn State University earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering.

# News Notes, Advocacy Opportunities, and Items of Interest

#### **BTU Position Statement on Distribution Centers/Warehouse Construction**

Discussions are being carried out concerning the construction of distribution centers throughout the Pocono region. Proposed projects are in various stages of planning, review, comment and hearings in Coolbaugh Township, Tunkhannock Township and Pocono Township. Potentially affected streams and their associated wetlands and tributaries are Mud Pond Run, Pocono Creek and Tobyhanna Creek.



BTU understands warehouse development will occur, and it believes that such development must be done in areas that do not impact the absorption, retention, filtration and free movement of rain water and other precipitation near cold-water resources. It should not reduce the size or quality of wetlands, provide damaging thermal and/or saline stress due to runoff, or cause increased siltation in our streams. The cold, clean trout waters for which the Poconos is known should not be degraded and BTU is willing to work with residents and local governments to achieve this goal.

## **Remember: Change of Regulations on Tobyhanna Lake**

#### (Inland trout regulations still apply prior to lake drawdown in spring 2025.)

Comments may be submitted by mail to: Executive Director, Fish and Boat Commission, P.O. Box 67000, Harrisburg, PA 17106-7000, within 30 days after publication of the notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Electronic submission can be made to RA-pfbcregulations@pa.gov. As before, just be sure to identify which proposal you are commenting upon.

#### **Comment On Proposed Regulatory Changes**

PFBC accepts comments on upcoming regulatory proposals via mail or the email RA-pfbcregulations@pa.gov. The proposed regulations are posted on line for your review and they are on the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* site. To review the proposed changes, you will need to navigate by following the steps below:

- 1. Click on this **Pennsylvania Bulletin link**
- 2. Under "BULLETIN", select the most recent volume.
- 3. Select the most recent issue(s).
- 4. Select "Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission" from the menu. You will see any pending proposals as a hyper-link. Select the proposal and it should open so you can read it.


