Stream Girls at Paradise Falls Lutheran Association

May 16-18 saw Brodhead TU partner once again with the Girl Scouts to provide instruction in the STREAM Girls program. The program "builds confidence and breaks down barriers in science and the outdoors. Through the eyes of a scientist, artist and angler, students make a personal connection to their home waters through activities and reflection. "Students collected and iden-



tified macroinvertebrates, calculated stream flows, hiked the riparian area, tied some flies, collaborated with peers and adults and, yes, did some fishing.









Bangor HS at CVNWR

On May 23 students from Bangor High School traveled to the Cherry Valley National Wildlife Refuge to participate in some field studies. These students tracked turtles using telemetry instruments, collected and identified macroinvertebrates, observed an electroshocking exercise and practiced fly casting. BTU Position Statement on Distribution Centers/Warehouse Construction

Discussions are being carried out concerning the construction of distribution centers throughout the Pocono region. Proposed projects are in various stages of planning, review, comment and hearings in Coolbaugh Township, Tunkhannock Township and Pocono Township. Potentially affected streams and their associated wetlands and tributaries are Mud Pond Run, Pocono Creek and Tobyhanna Creek.

BTU understands warehouse development will occur, and it believes that such development must be done in areas that do not impact the absorption, retention, filtration and free movement of rain water and other precipitation near cold-water resources. It should not reduce the size or quality of wetlands, provide damaging thermal and/or saline stress due to runoff, or cause increased siltation in our streams. The cold, clean trout waters for which the Poconos is known should not be degraded and BTU is willing to work with residents and local governments to achieve this goal.





Monroe County Additions to Class A Trout Waters

PA Fish and Boat Commissioners approved additions to the Class A Trout Waters list at their last meeting in April Three of those streams are in Monroe County: **Tank Creek, Yankee Run and Rattlesnake Creek.** A fourth, **Forest Hills Run,** was listed on the agenda and recommended but does not show up within the Pennsylvania Bulletin. We are reaching out for clarification and/or an explanation.

Remember, comments may be submitted by mail to: Executive Director, Fish and Boat Commission, P.O. Box 67000, Harrisburg, PA 17106-7000, within 30 days after publication of the notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Electronic submission can be made to RA-pfbcregulations@pa.gov. As before, just be sure to identify which proposal you are commenting upon.

Method to Comment On Proposed Regulatory Changes

To review the proposed changes in regulation, you need to navigate by following the steps below:

- 1. Click on this **Pennsylvania Bulletin link**.
- 2. Under "BULLETIN", select the most recent volume.
- 3. Select the most recent issue(s).
- 4. Select "Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission" from the menu. You will see any pending proposals as a hyperlink.
- 5. Select the proposal and it will open so you can read it.

Summer Is Approaching

May has come and gone and it brought all sorts of springtime weather: cold nights, warm days, rain - a LOT of it— and plenty of wind. When the weather wasn't awful and stream conditions were okay, finding and catching trout was certainly a possibility. Reports indicate hatches seemed a bit more sporadic and light. Hopefully, it was due to the recent conditions and not part of a long-term pattern.

But, that's in the past, so let's look to the present and to the future. Temperatures will soon be hitting daytime highs in the 70s and 80s. Sunrise is earlier and sunset is later. This means your prime fishing times may shift to early morning and early evening. Doesn't mean you can't catch trout at other times, but when the bugs are active, so are the trout.

Look for caddis and yellow sallies (stoneflies) at various times during the day. CDC or elk hair imitations of the former and perhaps a yellow humpy for the latter. Smaller green or dark gray caddis can be very effective in the morning on streams like the Brodhead. Of course, you can expect some Slate Drakes to be out along the streams so a mahogany bodied dun can

be a fine representation. Cooler rainy morning should bring some more blue-winged olives.

If you are fishing the evening session, don't forget some Light Cahill duns and nymphs. Also, don't leave your trusted rusty spinners at home.

Stream flows are dropping and the headwater tributaries are already at normal levels. The longer range forecast is for limited rainfall so conditions should be good for he next few weeks (fingers are crossed). Get out and enjoy our Pocono waters!

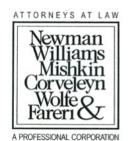
